Family Promise helps make family homelessness rare, short-lived, and —when it can't be prevented— a one-time experience.



For the past two decades, Family Promise of Gallatin Valley has provided comprehensive support to children and families experiencing housing insecurity. Our work is centered on creating stability through emergency shelter, transitional and workforce housing, prevention services, early learning opportunities, and long-term solutions that strengthen both families and the broader community.

Thousands of children and families have accessed housing, education, and supportive services through our programs. Families who once faced homelessness have gone on to secure employment, achieve financial independence, and build lasting stability. These outcomes reflect not only the resilience of the families we serve, but also the impact of staff, volunteers, and a community that has chosen to invest in long-term solutions to housing insecurity.

As we recognize this milestone, we remain focused on the ongoing and urgent need for housing solutions and childcare in our community. The progress of the past twenty years underscores what can be achieved when families, our neighbors, are given the resources and support to succeed.





Looking ahead, we are committed to expanding our reach, enhancing our services, and continuing to ensure that every child and family has the opportunity for safe housing and long-term stability.



### FAMILY RESOURCE NAVIGATION

Homelessness can often be prevented by linking families to community resources, helping them create a new budget, or providing essential items like food, diapers, or gas cards.

These early interventions address immediate needs and empower families to regain stability. By connecting families with support before a crisis escalates, we reduce the risk of homelessness and help maintain family unity. If a solution cannot be found through these efforts, families are referred to one of our housing programs, ensuring they have a safe place to turn and continued support on their path to stability.

Family Promise's Prevention and Diversion Programs identify families at the earliest signs of housing instability and provide targeted, high-impact interventions to keep them housed. By addressing immediate needs through financial assistance, case management, and community connections, the programs use fewer resources per family than long-term shelter programs and serve more households efficiently. The flexible design allows us to adapt to different family circumstances and scale across communities, offering a sustainable, cost-effective strategy to reduce homelessness.

Homeless prevention has broader social and economic benefits that include improving public health, reducing crime rates, enhancing workforce participation and ultimately saving taxpayer money through decreased reliance on emergency services.



"When [I got the call] saying that we got approved I was literally in tears. It was such a weight lifted off my shoulders and to be able to finally have that security that we have a place to bring our little ones to is such an amazing feeling. After so many denials it was great, but... if it wasn't for all your help and the leads you both would send me I would have probably never found this place!! #### Graduated support services

Stabilization Programs offer ongoing support to help families maintain housing and lower the risk of returning to homelessness. We remain connected as families transition out of Prevention, Diversion, or Housing services. These programs also assist families in addressing secondary challenges, including financial pressures, employment obstacles, mental health concerns, and past debts, helping them build a stronger foundation for long-term stability.

We are committed to supporting the advancement of individuals in our community who are working towards a brighter future. Thanks to a generous donor, we are proud to offer scholarships to Gallatin College as part of our mission to break the cycle of homelessness and poverty. This scholarship is designed to help students who are motivated to further their education and skills, offering an opportunity to build a foundation for long-term success.

#### 26 Families • 49 Children

Family Promise's Shelter Program offers temporary housing paired with individualized, trauma-informed, person-centered case management to guide families from homelessness to independent living. We support pregnant individuals, families with children under 18, and a wide range of family structures, providing immediate safety and care to those at risk of exposure to the elements.



Housing insecurity and homelessness harm entire families, but children bear a disproportionate long-term burden, especially in health, education, development and safety. Children experiencing homelessness:

- have 4x the rate of asthma
- have 5x more stomach problems
- are 3x more likely to attempt suicide
- are 4x more likely to drop out of school
- encounter developmental delays at 4x the rate of other kids

Supportive housing ensures families and individuals have access to safe, affordable homes. By keeping housing costs within reach, it prevents displacement, reduces financial strain, and creates a stable foundation for families to focus on work, education, and well-being.

Community plays a vital role for families living at A Journey Home. Beyond the immediate security of housing, connection with others fosters a sense of belonging, stability, and hope. Volunteers, staff, and fellow families create networks of support that reduce isolation and open doors to resources—from childcare to employment opportunities. Strong community support helps families rebuild stability and move forward with confidence.

\*Rent begins at \$500 per month and gradually increases every three months. Any amount paid beyond the initial \$500 is placed into a savings account, which is returned to the family when they exit the program.

\*Family Promise provides free childcare to employees to ease the financial burden of childcare. This benefit helps attract and retain dedicated educators while reinforcing our commitment to supporting families—both in the classroom and among our staff.

Rising Stars Early Learning Center offers affordable, high-quality early education that supports children's developmental growth. By providing reliable care, families can participate in the workforce, enhance their ability to support their household, and engage in the local economy.

Through hands-on experiences, community partners help Rising Stars children thrive - academically, socially, and emotionally - while building trust and meaningful connections. Local businesses, nonprofits, and volunteers bring unique expertise and opportunities— such as literacy programs, STEM activities, arts, and cultural enrichment—that expand learning beyond the classroom. These partnerships not only prepare children for long-term educational success but also strengthen family engagement and create lasting connections between Rising Stars students and the wider community.





#### HOUSING IS A BASIC NEED.

Safe, stable shelter is as essential to human survival and well-being as food, water, and healthcare. Housing provides protection, safety, and a foundation for both physical and mental health. With secure housing, children can maintain consistent routines and thrive in school, while adults are able to focus on employment and supporting their families. In contrast, unstable housing is linked to chronic illness, stress, and developmental delays in children, preventing families from meeting even their most basic needs.

Housing insecurity and homelessness harm entire families, but children bear the greatest burden—affecting their health, education, development, and safety. Without intervention, these challenges often extend into adulthood, influencing long-term outcomes in health, employment, and relationships.

Babies and toddlers are among the most vulnerable Americans, facing some of the highest rates of eviction and housing instability, and poses a serious threat to their early development and overall well-being. During these crucial formative years, a lack of stable housing can disrupt a child's physical health, emotional security, and cognitive growth. Without a safe and consistent environment, young children face setbacks that can impact their education and future success. Supporting families with young children is essential to breaking the cycle of poverty and ensuring every child has the chance to grow and thrive in a stable, nurturing home.

Housing is the anchor for stability, opportunity, and a stronger future.
